In attendance were {6 } residents, {18 } industry representatives and government officials. (See the attached list.)

Pipeline Audit Presentation: Dan Sarnecki and Craig Collins

- Presentation specific to Pipeline Construction and Integrity Management-Thank you to BonaVista for taking the time to present this information to the group.

AER Update: Rhonda King

- There is a new pipeline inspector hired out of the Drayton Valley Field Office.
- The AER is still focussing on operating efficiently and effectively as a full cycle regulator.
- With reference to the presentation, The AER will be conducting 300 Detailed Pipeline Operational inspections (audits) this year that involve 70 companies. The goal of the AER is to see a 4% reduction in pipeline incidents.

Industry Updates:

Conoco Phillips: Jill Salus

- No activity in the BLWS, just our normal operations.
- We are drilling and tying in 5 wells in the Rimbey Bluffton area, they are sweet horizontal gas wells.

BonaVista Energy: Eleanor Vokes/Billy Joe Waldo

- In this area, Statements of Concerns have been reviewed and responses will be forth coming to all those that had submitted them in the near future.
- Other:
Drilling rig at 13-6-45-2w5 Then moving to 4-26-45-2w5
Turnarounds at 11-9-44-2W5, 11-20-44-2W5, 14-27-45-1W5 and these facilities should be back up and running September 17th or 18th.

Baytex Energy: Len Larson

- Turnaround at 2-27-46-2-W5 battery was finished up at the beginning of September.

Journey Energy: Alan Browse

- No new updates at this time.

Questfire Energy Corp: Ted Thompson

- Currently, Questfire is inspecting Value Sites on the Crystal Pipeline during the turnaround at the Rimbey Gas Plant.
- No new activities are planned for this area at this time.

Kingsmere Resources Ltd: Dennis Miller

- Kingsmere Resources is in the process of selling to Inplay Oil.
- Dennis introduced Les Miller and Lance Chorney from Inplay Oil.
- Drilling at the 1-10-46-2W5 (4-14 surface) has been deferred pending sale of the company.
- No other activity scheduled at this time.

Resourceful Petroleum: Chris Kirby

- Chris shared a map showing the preliminary routing of the pipeline that RPC is proposing to construct from a wellsite at 6-16-46-3w5 to a wellsite at 1-22-46-3w5. This would be an 8-inch nominal diameter pipeline with maximum operating pressure of 1440 psi. Construction would occur during the winter to take advantage of frozen ground to minimize any potential damage. Watercourse crossings would be directionally bored, and the route has been selected to minimize disturbance by running parallel to existing pipeline right of ways and avoiding sensitive areas. Construction and operating practices will meet or exceed AER requirements and standard industry practices.

County of Wetaskiwin: Kathy Rooyakkers

- County Concerns:
 - Increased drilling (over 500 wells in the past year)-hence increased traffic on County roads. The County roads simply cannot handle the traffic.
 - Heavy/overloaded trucks on County roads.
 - Road use agreements are in place, but tickets can only be issued if the drivers are caught.

Community Updates:

Dave Doze:

- Dave asked Bonavista if they are still looking at 14-10, and if they plan on keep looking at that location. Billy Joe responded that they are and that Bonavista will follow up with Dave.
- Dave shared information on an upcoming WPSRG presentation. As per attached to these minutes.

Ken Jenny:

- Wanting to know the cumulative effects of industry (land value). Paul recommended we plan on this as an Action Item.

Graham Gilchrist: Consultant

- In the process of reviewing the change in land value regarding AC vs. DC Power lines.
