MEMBER AND GUEST INTRODUCTIONS – Welcome. Introductions were done.

REVIEW OF AGENDA – Agenda approved by consensus.

PREVIOUS MEETING NOTES – Nov. 2017. Minutes presented at the meeting
approved by consensus.

PRESENTATION – Constable Will Ogden and Constable Luke Giles from the RCMP reported that the last month has been quieter. They have some success with GPS trackers especially on batteries stolen from oil leases in the past few days. There is usually little on the way of evidence left at crime scenes. Video surveillance and trackers on items help. They try to raise public awareness not to leave keys in vehicles, be sure items purchased on Kijji are not stolen, and report suspicious activity. Dispatch for non emergency numbers are the Rimbey Detachment is 403-843-2223. For emergencies call 911. The RCMP are starting up a community group consisting of oil industry, town and

country to set priorities for the detachment. Meetings would be approx. twice a year for foreseeable future. First meeting will be in March. If you are interested contact Luke at the RCMP detachment.

-Dale Adie from the County of Ponoka Citizens on Patrol gave a report. The citizens on patrol group is for the rural areas in the County and is 95% registered as a COP. RCMP criminal record checks will be done on members. They hope to cover Leedale, Forshee, Bluffton, Liberty areas etc. The County has donated \$2500 towards COP groups. Cars doing the patrolling will have dash cams and signs on the doors. Town of Rimbey has started a COP group as well.

- Linda Campbell reported on Rural Crime Watch. Their annual meeting is on Feb. 20/18 in the Upper Auditorium of the Rimbey Community Centre with supper at 6 p.m. and meeting to follow. Tickets are \$20 and available at Stationery, Stories and Sounds. They are pleased to see the COP groups being organized.

- Glynn Bates from Fraction Energy Services Ltd. Gave a power point presentation on "Water Management Considerations for Hydraulic Fracturing". He gave an overview of his company's services. His presentation was on how water and environment impact is being reduced. The big hose lines you see in the ditches will move water more efficiently than by truck. "C" rings are modular tanks used at sites to store fresh or salt water and are double lined. Option of recycling produced water and flowback are taken into consideration within company or in cooperation with other companies. Environmental consideration of bird nets, fish screen, wildlife surveys and containment are considered. Safety and risk mitigation as well as partnership with First Nations were discussed.

FOLLOW UP - Rick Anderson will be sending out the invoices to companies prior to the end of the month.
