- Geer Energy has been notified of the opportunity to join the Rimbey Regional Synergy Group. Rick asked if there was any one in the room that could possibly visit with them to explain the purpose of the group.

PRESENTATION - AER

Mandy Dumanski, Senior Environmental Toxicologist for AER gave a presentation on the flow back study that has been carried out by AER and Alberta Health. The study was to understand what chemicals are sent to flare after a well is fractured. Sampling of the flowback was carried out for a 72 hours period every 2 hours. 5 wells test results have been tabulated with 2 more to do. 5 operators had volunteered to be part of the study, currently only 2 operators are actively fracking in the Cardium zone which is the zone of interest. The full report is expected to be completed by early fall of 2017. Alberta Health will be conducting a second analysis directed at post flare bi-products.

PRESENTATION - Trican

Julia Martin, Trican presentation "Clean Track" which can be viewed on Youtube. Trican has developed a long term road dust suppression product. The proposed application would be for rural roads, lease sites, private roads to reduce dust from traffic. This product is moisture repelling, improves visibility and provides reduced maintenance. Easy to apply with a spray bar or nozzle. Cost effective, long term coating. There is no salt in product so it does not attract wildlife to roadways. There are further studies underway. Trican has submitted applications as required to the Alberta Government for approval. There were many questions which Julia and her team answered very thoroughly.
