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# **Orphan Well Association**

- OWA is <u>not</u> a Government Organization
- Non-profit organization
- Operate under the delegated authority of Alberta Energy Regulator (AER)
  - Orphan Fund Delegated Administration Regulation (OFDAR)
  - But financially and legally separate from the AER
- Primarily funded by the Alberta oil and natural gas industry



# **Orphan Well Association Mandate**



To decommission Orphan oil and gas infrastructure and reclaim the land similar to its original state in a safe, principled, and cost-efficient manner



# What is an Orphan?



- Well, facility, pipeline or associated site
- Regulatory Designation that is <u>determined by</u>
  <u>AER</u>
- No legally responsible or financially viable party
  - <u>100% Working Interest only</u>
- Only <u>after</u> Insolvency Proceedings
  - OWA funds many receiverships
- Access only
  - OWA does not step into "shoes" of defunct company
  - Does not hold surface or mineral leases




# What if less than 100% Working Interest?

- Property does <u>not</u> become an Orphan
  - Can be confusing for landowners
- AER directs Working Interest Participant(s) (WIPs) to manage site
  - 1. Working Interest Participant(s) may decommission & reclaim site
    - Significant backlog of work to be completed
    - OWA reimburses WIPs for defunct company's portion of costs (Working Interest Claim WIC)
      - After suspension, decommissioning, remediation, or reclamation (Rec Certified)
  - 2. Site can also be transferred from Defunct Company to Active Company
  - 3. New Option WIPA agreement for OWA to conduct work



# How to confirm if the OWA is Managing a Site

- Sign on lease
- OWA Website: Interactive Map
- Letter from OWA to landowner
- If Not OWA -contact OrphaningInsolvency@aer.ca







#### **How Sites are Prioritized**

- All sites are risk-ranked upon intake
  - Spud date, H<sub>2</sub>S, proximity to receptors, etc.
- Top Priority Public Safety
- Second Priority Efficient Operations
  - Sites grouped into area projects to gain <u>cost efficiencies</u>
    (Area Based Closure ABC's)
- Third Priority Chronological
  - Amount of time since site has been designated as Orphan



### When and how will a Landowner be contacted?

#### After site designated as an Orphan

- First we must identify & contact landowner.
  This can be difficult.
- Landowner receives Information package in mail
  - Who is the OWA legal rights, contact information
  - Land and Property Rights Tribunal contact surface lease payments/recovery of compensation
  - What work will be conducted on site
- Prime Contractor contacts landowner when field work begins
  - Decommissioning and reclamation
- Landowner participates in Phase 1 review during Reclamation



#### **Access Issues for the OWA**

- Many landowners have been impacted by defunct operators
  - Surface rent owed
  - Poor site condition weeds, etc.
- Cannot pay back rent
  - Landowner must apply to Land and Property Rights Tribunal (LPRT)
- Don't pay for access
  - Not like an oil and gas company
  - Limited options



# **Authority of the OWA**

#### OWA is a delegate authority of the AER

- Legal access under Legislation
- Abandonment (Decommissioning)
  - Section 101 of OGCA Entry on land
- Remediation and Reclamation
  - Section 250 of EPEA Right of Entry, Environmental Protection Order (EPO) also issued


#### Most landowners work with OWA

- However, OWA is obligated to notify LPRT if site access is restricted
  - Surface Rights Act 36(8)....
  - May impact landowners' ability to collect back rentals
- Overall positive relationship with majority of landowners
- Other issues: Pace of work, weeds, understanding of process






# **Change in Annual Orphan Well Inventory**




# Increase in Orphan Reclamation Inventory (at year end)



# **OWA Funding**

- Funded by the Annual Orphan Levy on O&G Producers (not taxpayers)
  - Total industry levies to date \$581 million
- Recommended 2023 Orphan Levies
  - \$135mm (Orphan Well) and \$0 (Large Facility)
- Each Licensee's Annual Levy:
  - $\frac{\sum Licensee's \ AER \ Estimated \ Liability}{\sum All \ Provincial \ AER \ Estimated \ Liability}$  X Total Annual Levy
- Other sources of funding:
  - Alberta and Federal <u>interest free loans</u> (\$335mm and \$200mm)
- OWA was <u>NOT</u> eligible for Alberta's Site Rehabilitation Program (SRP)
  - \$1 Billion Grant from Federal Government 2020-2023
